Douglass Science Institute Program Series (DSI)

DSI is a four-year summer residential program for young women that begins the summer before they enter 9th grade. Participants explore a variety of areas including biology, chemistry, technology, environmental and marine sciences, engineering, physics, and mathematics. During exciting hands-on labs, workshops, and field trips, students explore new horizons in these technical areas and find how to build a future around them. Participants also learn about career options in math, science, and engineering by talking with undergraduates, Rutgers University faculty, and women working in the corporate world. The program aims to create an exciting a supportive environment to nurture students intellectually, creatively, and socially. Participating students are encouraged to share their ideas and work cooperatively with new friends both in the classroom and through informal group activities.

Project SUPER 2008

Project SUPER (*Science for Undergraduates: A Program for Excellence in Research*): This enrichment program, for undergraduate women pursuing careers in math and science, provides peer and faculty mentoring, an undergraduate credit-bearing-course "Introduction to Scientific Research," and undergraduate research experiences in science, math, engineering and technology as well as a myriad of activities and support services designed to assist in academic, career/professional and personal development. The program also encourages participants to continue their studies in these fields by enrolling in Master's and Ph.D. programs. Project SUPER is open to all first-year students at Douglass College and affiliates of Douglass College from the School of Engineering or the College of Pharmacy at Rutgers-New Brunswick. Site Coordinators will be required to work 10 hours per week in the Douglass Project Office starting June 16, 2008
