

GRADES OF D

If a student earns a grade of D and repeats the course, both grades are computed in the cumulative grade-point average, but the student receives degree credit only the first time. The second grade is prefixed with a K.

GRADES OF F

In general, when a course is repeated in which a student previously earned a grade of F, both the original grade of F and the new grade remain on the transcript and in the cumulative grade point average. However, for up to four courses repeated at Rutgers, the student may elect to have the original grade of F removed from the cumulative grade point average, although it will remain on the transcript. A student may exercise this option for any four courses during the undergraduate years, but it may be used only once for a given course. A student elects this option by filling out a form in the office of Academic Services at any time after the completion of the term in which the course is repeated. Once the form has been submitted, the first grade is E credited and the second grade is used in the cumulative grade point average, even if it is also F. Election of this option may not be revoked.
