

**Summary.**

Seven woody aliens are found in Hutcheson Forest, two of which, the Norway maple and the sweet cherry, are present in the canopy of the forest. All have proved hardy to winter storms and temperatures as well as to the drought of 1957.

Both the Norway maple and the sweet cherry have seed sources in the forest and can be considered as naturalized in the area.

At present, the Tree-of-heaven and the Princess-tree hold a very minor rank in the community.

The most rampant alien is the Japanese honeysuckle, being able to shade out seedlings and destroy young saplings.

Berberis Thunbergii and Rosa multiflora are not abundant or important at the present time. Of the two, Rosa multiflora appears to be increasing in numbers at the present time, while Berberis Thunbergii shows no similar trend.
