

# **Ilse Stanley, 64, Rescued Jews From Nazi Prisons**

**BOSTON, July 21 (AP)—Ilse Stanley, credited with rescuing 400 fellow Jews from German prison camps, died Sunday at New England Baptist Hospital. She was 64 years old and lived at Gilmanton Ironworks, N. H., with her husband, Milton.**

**In her 1957 biography "The Unforgotten," Mrs. Stanley recalled her years as an actress in Germany before World War II and how she duped the Nazis during the war years by walking into concentration camps with forged papers.**

**After she fled to New York, she and her husband produced plays. They moved from Boston to the New Hampshire village in 1960 to run a vegetable garden. When that venture failed they began conducting auctions.**
